Thank you to all students who brought in food to share, took part in the fashion walk, hosted the henna tattoo stall and performed songs and dances – you were all amazing. ©













CAREER OF THE FORTNIGHT - FORENSIC SCIENTIST



A forensic scientist applies scientific methods to analyse and interpret physical evidence in criminal investigations. These experts work in laboratories, specializing in various disciplines such as DNA analysis, toxicology, ballistics, and trace evidence examination. The primary responsibility of a forensic scientist is to conduct thorough and precise examinations of evidence collected from crime scenes, providing critical insights that aid law enforcement agencies in solving

Forensic scientists employ advanced technologies and methodologies to analyse evidence, ranging from biological samples to materials found at crime scenes.

FURTHER INFORMATION – FORENSIC SCIENTIST

How much can I earn?

The average salary ranges from £18,000 - £45,000.

What it takes -

You'll need:

- To be thorough & pay attention to detail
- Patience & the ability to remain calm in stressful situations
- Excellent written communication skills
- Legal knowledge including court procedures & government regulations

Entry requirements -

You can do a degree or postgraduate qualification in forensic science or a related subject like chemistry, biological science, physics or medical sciences.

Entry to jobs is competitive, so it may help to choose a university qualification accredited by The Chartered Society of Forensic Sciences.
